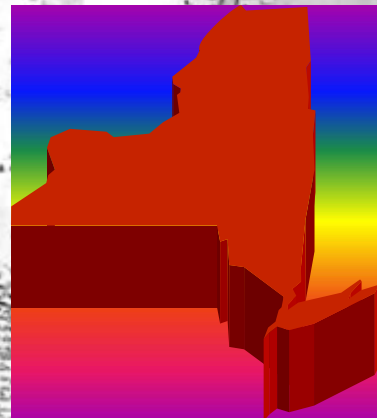

- New York was founded in 1664. At the time it was called New Amsterdam. New York was claimed by King Charles II and given to the king's brother.

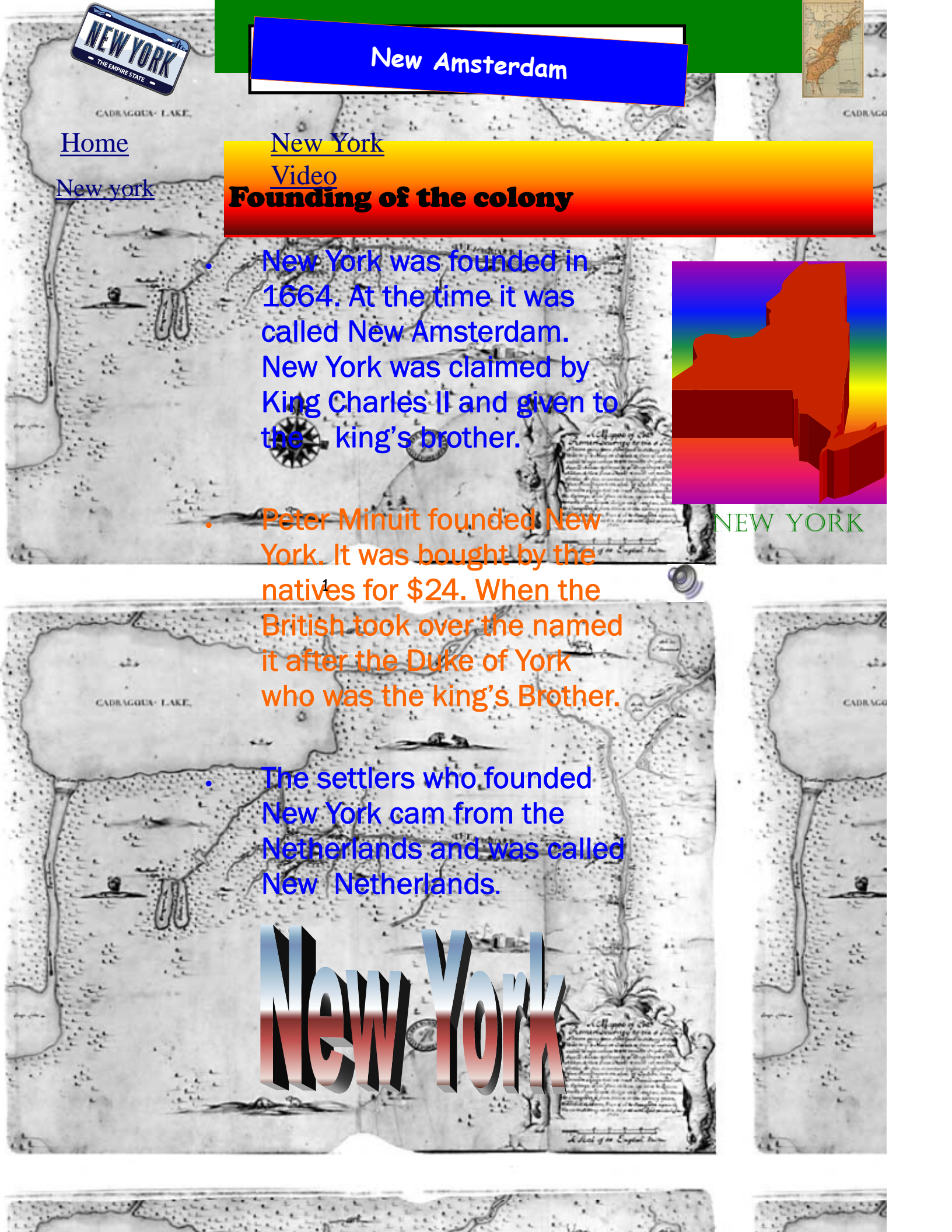
- Peter Minuit founded New York. It was bought by the natives for \$24. When the British took over the named it after the Duke of York who was the king's Brother.

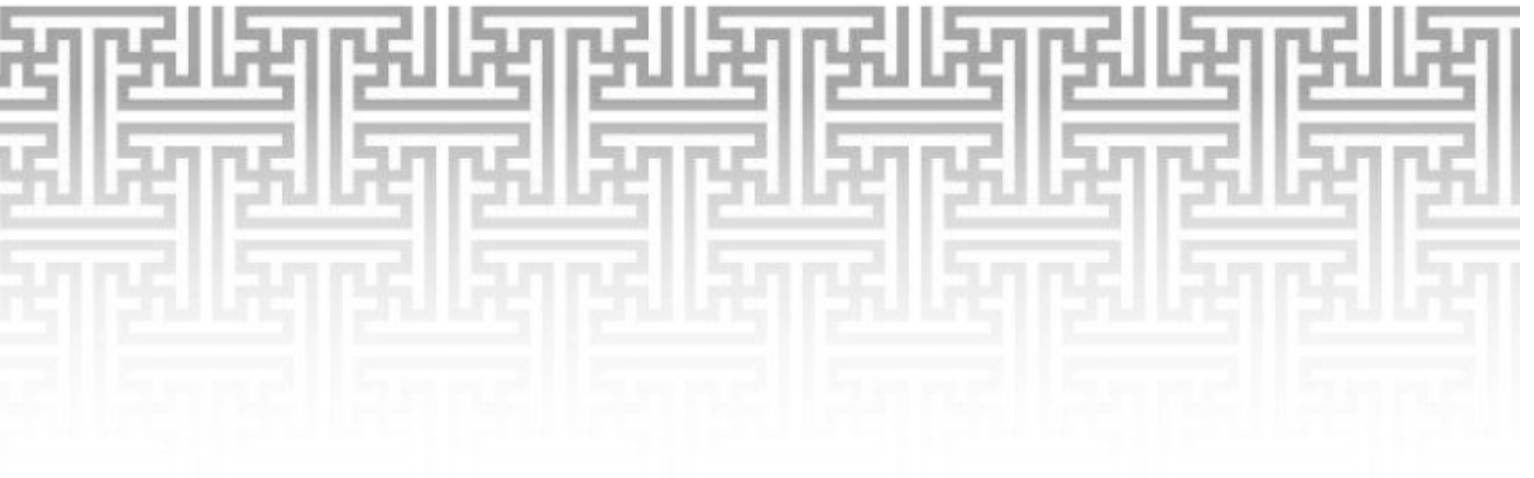
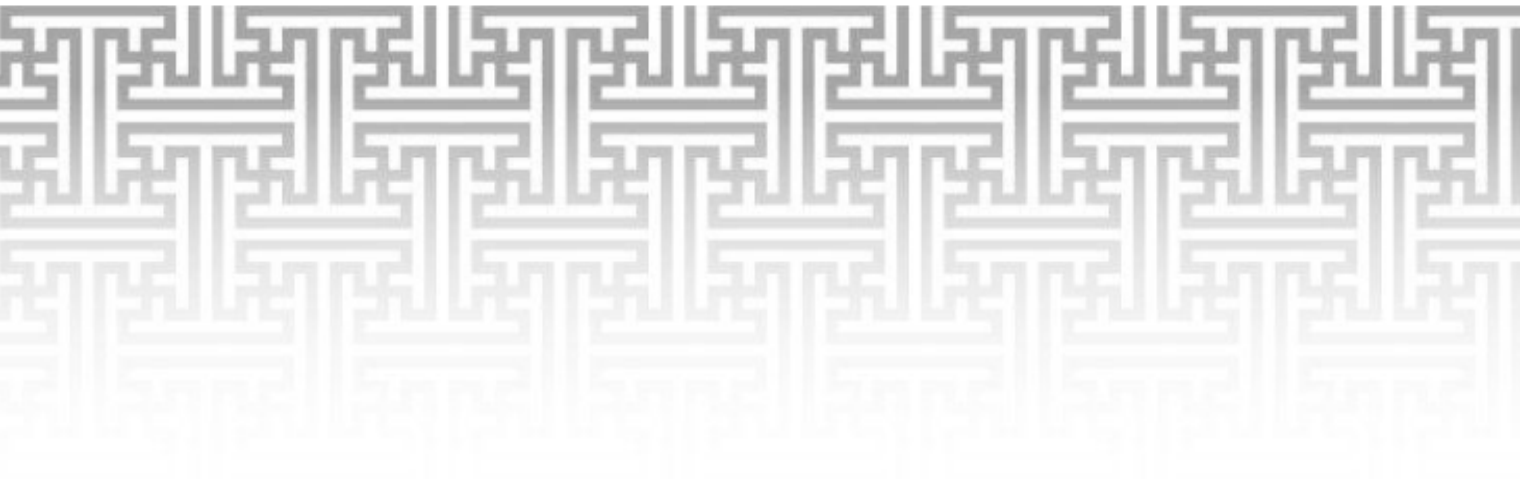
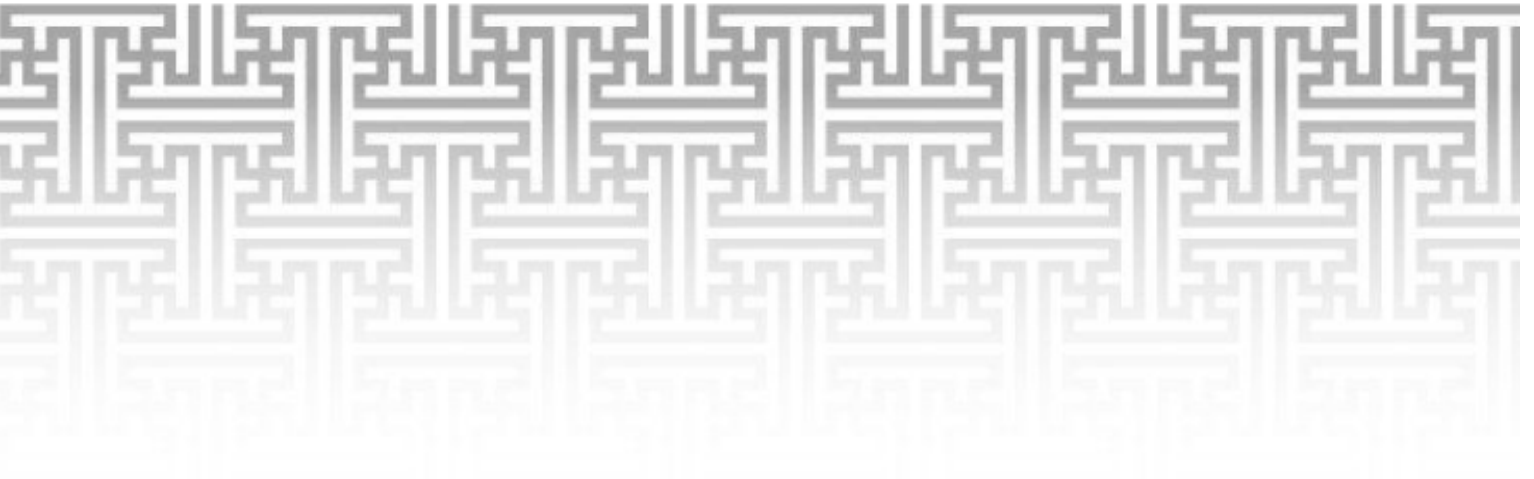
- * In New York one of the many tribes was called the Mohawk Indians. Also the Manhattan Indians had settled there. They were here before the Dutch.

Some other jobs included a boyer which was someone who makes bows. A fletcher would make arrows. A taylor would sew clothes and a cutler would make knives.
- In early New York the schooling and education were very religious. Girls rarely went to school unless they were Quakers. Most of the schools were private schools. When kids were at school they used horn books. Horn books would have the alphabet and the Our Father prayer on them. It was made of wodd and not really a book.
