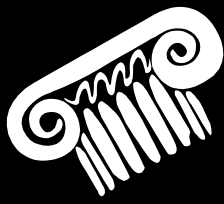

Roger Williams was considered the founder of Rhode Island. Even though he was the founder, there were many Indians that were there before him. House Hold

A common house hold utensil used to churn butter was called a Butter Churn. The Butter Churn was a cylindrical utensil that involved pumping of the arms. Most women were too busy to do this job, so children did it.

The utensil used to take hot coals and scoop them up was called a Fire Scoop. It was used to put under beds in order to keep the lower body of the user warm.

The utensil used to start a fire was called a Bellows. Blowing huffs of air into the fir place to create a fire.

The utensil used to scoop hot coals from a fire was , ironically enough, called the fire scoop. It was used to put under beds in order to keep the feet of the user warm.

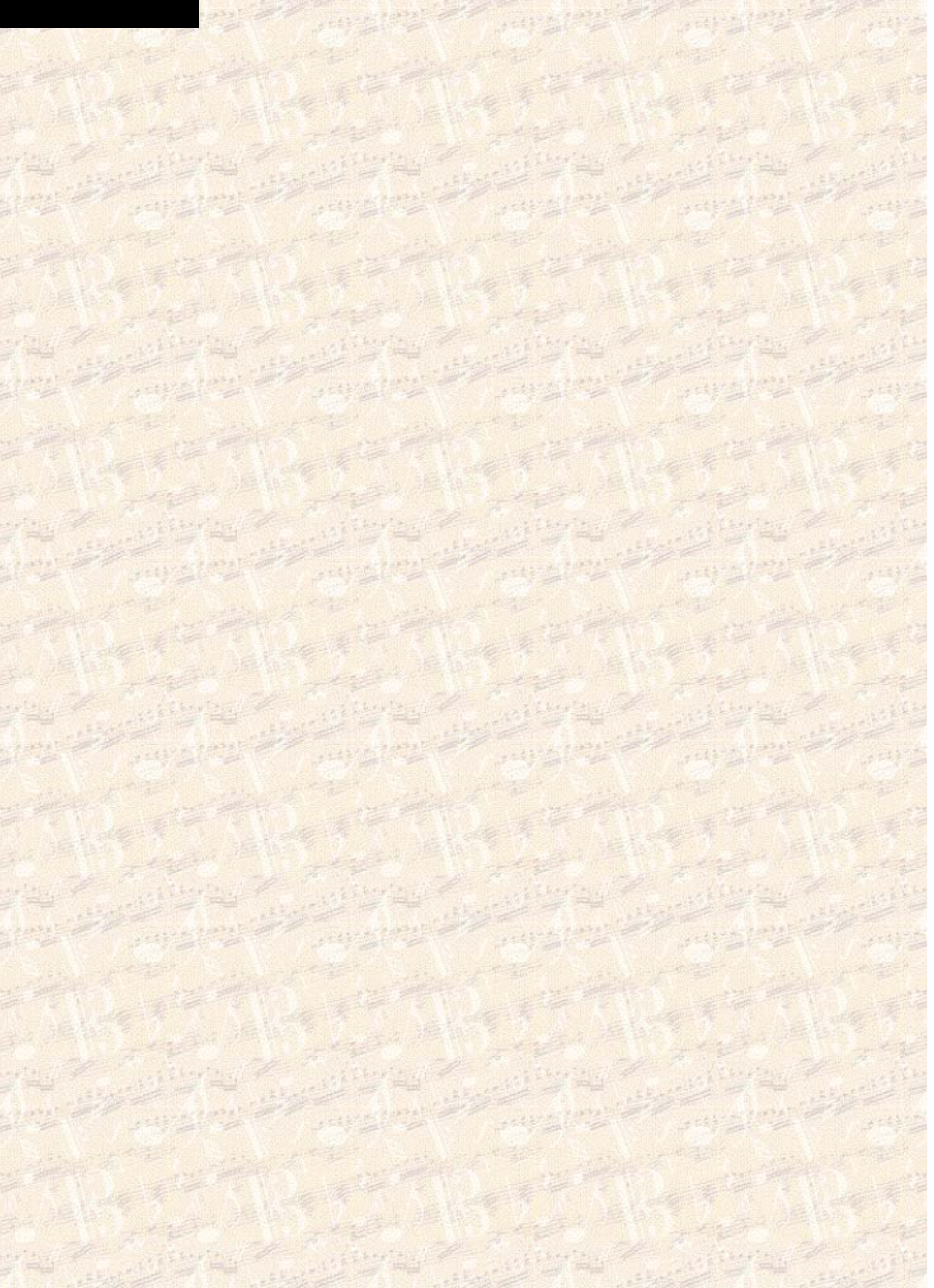


Here is a field filled with flowers and a barn behind it.

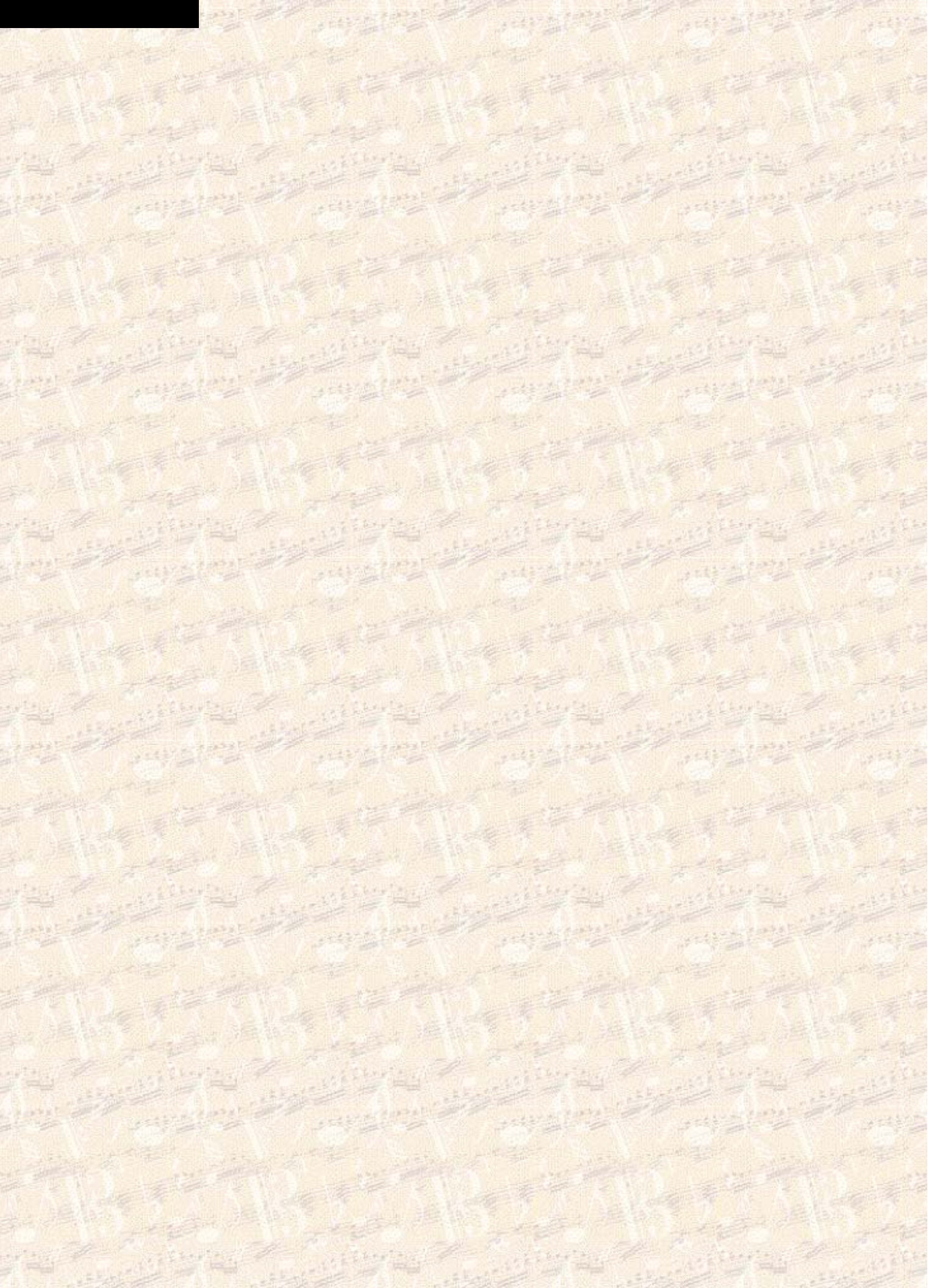
