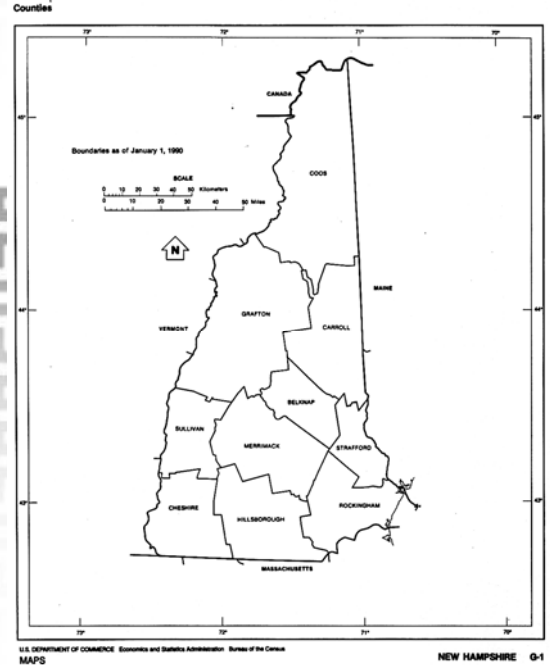


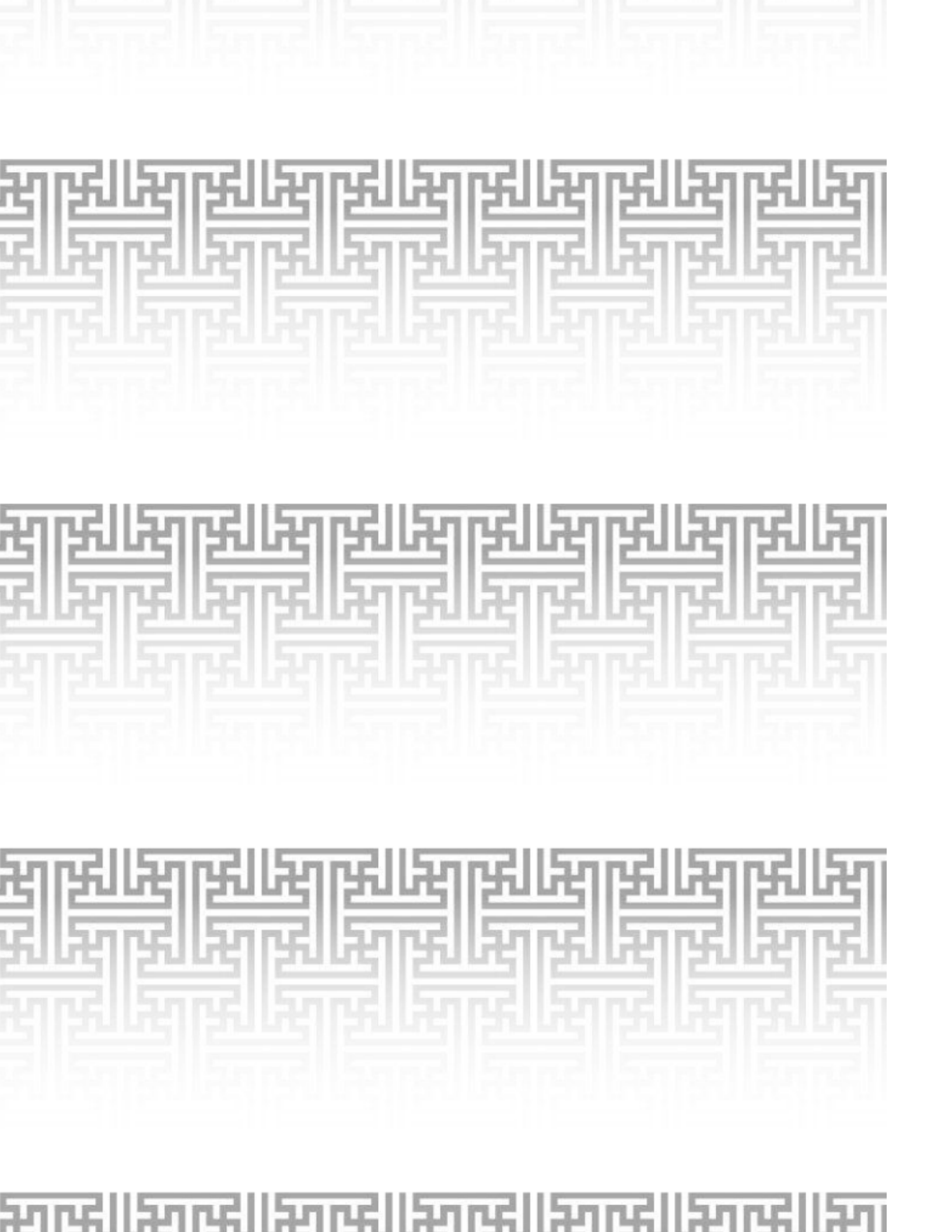

Economy




The New Hampshire Colony had two major industries. One was agriculture, such as: potatoes, and fishing. The other major industry was manufacturing, such as: textiles and ship building. Those were the major industries.

The agriculture in the colony of New Hampshire was important. It was important because they needed the crops so they could have enough meals. If they did not have enough crops they could starve.

Some Examples of crops in the New Hampshire Colony were beans and pumpkins. Their main crop was Corn, which was served in every meal. Later on, they learned to grow other things. The other things they grew were: wheat, barley, pats, pears and apples.

Slavery started in the New Hampshire Colony in 1645. Around the years 1773 and 1786, the number of slaves in the New Hampshire Colony went down. This was because war time attrition destroyed slavery.

Children played important roles in the colonial times. They started doing chores at the age of three. The most important roles for them was making candles and soap. This is because their fingers were small enough to pick the berries that make wax.

The first natives to arrive at the New Hampshire Colony were the Pennacook. The Indians and the people of the New Hampshire Colony got along well. The Natives showed them how to farm, hunt, and find plants that are useful for medicines.
