### Founding Of The Colony.

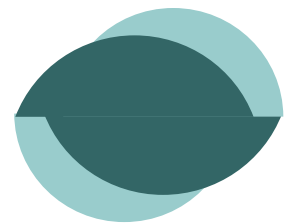
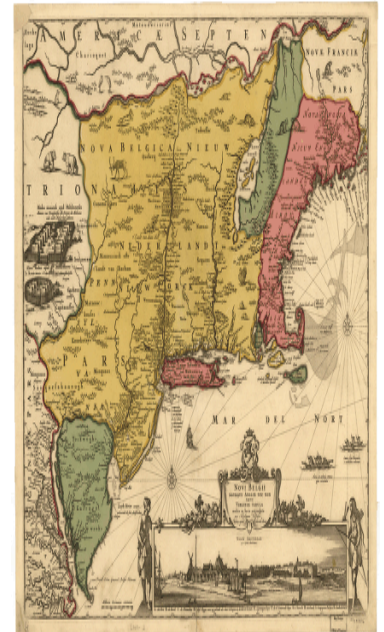
New Hampshire was established in 1622, When Thomson and his fellow group members were at sea for five months then in April 1623 they reached southeastern New Hampshire. They decided to build their settlement at Odiorne's Point.

### Founding Of The Colony.

The founder of New Hampshire was David Thomson. In late 1622 him and his group, decided to sail from Plymouth five months later they reached New Hampshire. They cut down trees and were on their way to start a settlement. They built a fort where they could trade with Indians.
